April 13th and 14th for Reading

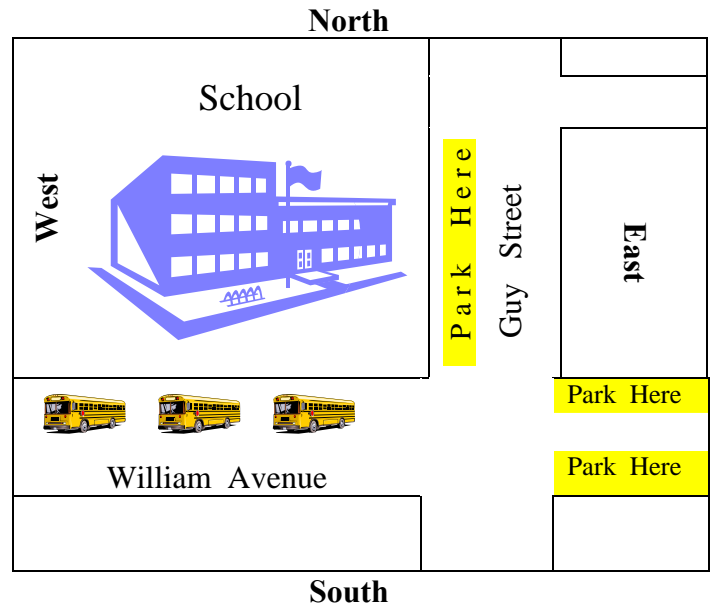
April 20th and 21st for Math

Please make sure your child is in school these days and ready to give their best efforts. This is a time for them to show how much they have learned!

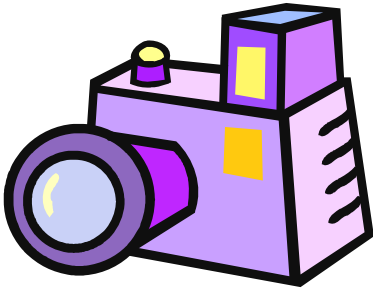

MEMORY BOOKS ARE HERE!



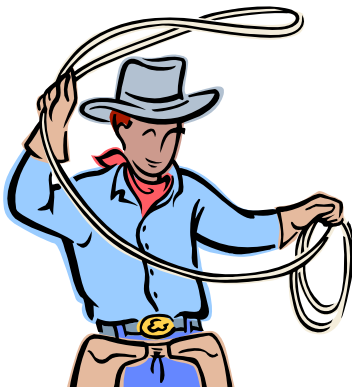
Memory books from this school year will arrive soon. If you would like for me to reserve a book for you, please fill out the form below and send \$7.75 or a check made out to

Michelle Schnitzler

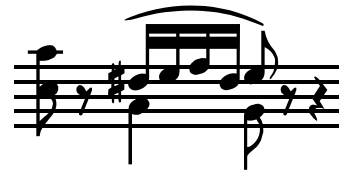


Hi, my name is Michelle Schnitzler. I am working as a Title I paraprofessional and a playground and lunchroom helper.

FROM THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION TEACHERS...

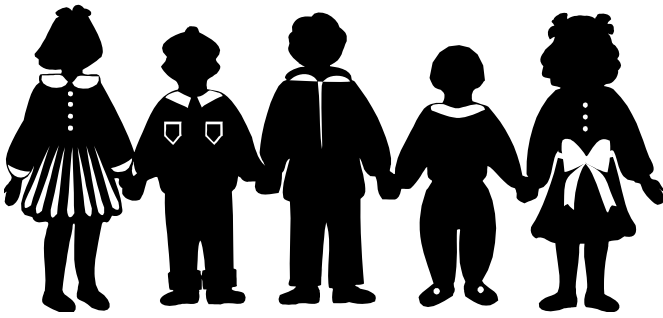


One of the most interesting books I read this year was *Brain Rules: 12 Principles for Surviving and Thriving at Work, Home, and School* by molecular biologist John Medina. Although it sounds intimidating, he's done a great job sharing what scientists know for sure about how our brain works and how to transform those ideas into our daily lives.

So what is rule #1? You guessed it: EXERCISE! He goes on to explain why this happens on a molecular level and sites several studies to back his claims. One finding was that when students jogged 30 minutes a day 2 or 3 times a week, their cognitive performance improved significantly. When the program stopped, scores fell. Exercise is critical to thinkers of all ages, whether in a classroom, office, or retirement village. Just walking 30 minutes a day will affect the brain. Add some strength training a few days a week and the results for the brain, not to mention the body, are even greater.

Now that's truly PHYSICAL EDUCATION!

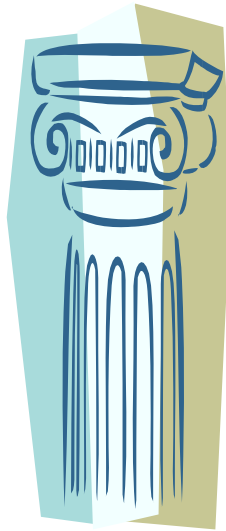
April and May offer many opportunities for you to be an active part of our school day. Please check your schedule and share some time with us. We also have things to be done at home! Let me know!

Author, storyteller, and naturalist, Kevin Strauss, will be at Dassel Elementary that day to present animal folktales and real life stories about animals to the staff and students. Parents and other community members are also welcome.

From Rochester, MN, Mr. Strauss has been presenting programs across the Midwest to schools, libraries and other groups for over a decade. He received a Bachelor's Degree in Environmental Biology/Creative Writing at Beloit College in Wisconsin and a Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction at Northern Illinois University. He taught at several nature centers, and has served as Executive Director at the innovative Prairie Ecology Bus Center in Lakefield, Minnesota.

Kevin's books and CDs have won several national awards including the **Parents Choice Award** and the **Storytelling World Award**. He is the author of C/Ds and books for children, including “The Mountain Wolf's Gifts: Gift Tales from Around the World” (C/D), *Loon and Moon and Other Stories*, and *The Song of the Wolf: Legends and Folktales from Around the World*.
